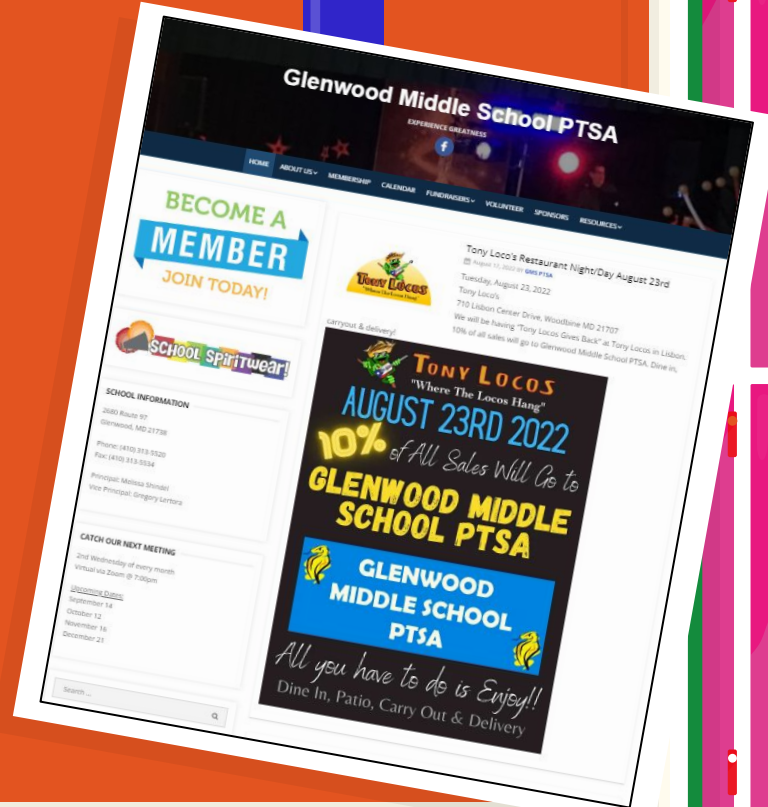

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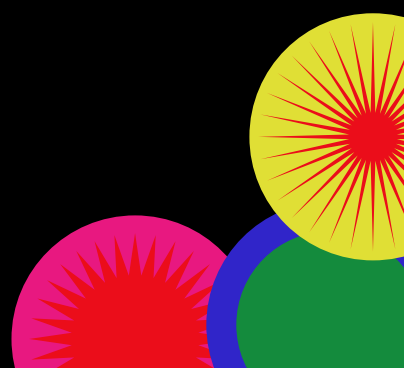

1. Start at 0. Turn dial **RIGHT** 3 whole turns until you reach the first number of the combination.



2. Turn dial **LEFT** one time past above number and continue until you reach the second number.



3. Turn dial **RIGHT** until you reach the third number holding the dial tightly. The lock will release automatically as you pull the dial.



Please memorize your number and keep your locker combination in a safe place.

*The lock will tighten as you approach the 3rd number. When you hear a “click”, pull the door open.

Laptops

Students will use their laptops for instruction during the school day.



Cellphones

Personal devices like cell phones and smart watches need to be “away for the day” which means off and out of sight. This includes lunch, recess, hallways and bathrooms.



Social Media

- Social media is the #1 cause of anxiety, depression and stress in teenagers. **ESPECIALLY FOR GIRLS!**
- Most platforms require users to be at least 13 years old.
- MANY peer conflicts start on line. Students can face disciplinary consequences for activity on social media posts.
- Please consider not giving your child access, or at least blocking these sites during school hours.



Normal Peer Conflicts

- ★ Equal social power or friends
- ★ Happens occasionally/accidentally
- ★ Not serious
- ★ Equal emotional reaction
- ★ Not seeking power/attention/control
- ★ Not trying to get something or coerce
- ★ Remorse- takes responsibility
- ★ Desire to solve the problem/repair the relationship

Bullying

- Imbalance of power/not friends
 - Repeated negative actions/words
 - Purposeful
 - May involve serious threat or physical/emotional harm
 - Strong emotional reaction from victim, little/none from aggressor
 - Aggressor seeks to gain power, control, possession
 - No remorse- blames victim
 - No effort/desire to resolve/repair
