Arrival and Dismissal

• Arrival:

- All students may enter at 8:30 a.m.
- Warning bell at 8:38 a.m.
- Students should go right to homeroom no loitering
- Students must be in homeroom by 8:40 a.m.

• Dismissal:

• All students are dismissed at 3:25 p.m.

• Bus Riders:

- Busses will dismiss students at 8:30 a.m. to enter the building
- Do you know your child's:
 - Bus number?
 - Bus stop?
 - Pick-up (and drop-off) times?
 - Arrive early!

• Car Riders:

- The car rider doors will open at 8:30 a.m. to allow students to enter the building
- We encourage students to ride the bus. Students must be in homeroom by 8:40 a.m. If the car rider lane is long and students are late, they will be marked tardy to school. This is not an excused tardy.

• Car Riders:

- Cars should enter at the Old Bushy Park entrance (not at the light)
- You can drive up onto the blacktop in the mornings and drop off at one of the doors
- Drop-off starts at 8:30 a.m.





Dismissal

• All Students:

- All students are dismissed at 3:25 p.m.
- Lockers → bus. Staff do a sweep to clear building
- Some students walk to the park, community center, library this is an arrangement you make with your child. Reach out to an administrator if you have a concern.

Dismissal

• Car Riders:

- Cars should enter at the Old Bushy Park entrance (not at the light)
- Line up at the stop sign on the access road. Students will walk to meet you.

First Day Procedures

- Bus riders enter through the front doors.
- Car riders enter from the doors on the blacktop.
- All students will report to their homeroom/period 1 class by 8:40 a.m.
- We will be on a modified schedule the first four days of school to work on building community, reviewing school policies and procedures, teaching our R.I.S.E. expectations, and discussing instructional expectations as it pertains to academic integrity

- \$3.30
- Students do not have to pre-order



Free and Reduced Meals (More than meals!)

Cell Phones

Personal communication devices like <u>cell phones</u> and <u>smart watches</u> need to be on "off and away all day" which means off/silent and out of sight. This includes lunch, recess, hallways and bathrooms.



Laptops

Students will use their laptops for instruction during the school day. Students will receive laptops today!

Social Media

- Please monitor your child's social media
- We strongly encourage
 - Not giving your child access
 - Requiring strict privacy settings
 - Setting time limits
 - Removing phones overnight
- Oftentimes an age requirement of 13
- Texts, posts, emails & apps <u>Trust but verify</u>
- Cautions:
 - Friendships struggle
 - Cyberbullying



What Can We Do If We Suspect Bullying/Cyberbullying?

Normal Peer Conflict

- Peers have equal power or are friends with each other.
- Conflict happens occasionally or rarely.
- May be accidental.
- May not be serious; no threat of harm.
- Equal emotional reaction from both peers.
- Not seeking power or attention and not trying to gain something.
- General remorse will want to take responsibility.
- Effort on both sides to solve the problem.

Bullying/Harassment

- Imbalance of power between peers; not friends.
- Repeated negative actions that happens often.
- Purposefully done.
- Serious with threat of physical or emotional harm.
- Strong emotional reaction from victim and little or no emotional reaction from bully.
- Seeking power, control or material things.
- No remorse bully blames victim; no guilt from bully.
- No effort to solve the problem.
