1) Student Delegate Applications due by 2/23/2024

Visit the <u>SMOB Portal</u> and find the "Student Delegate Application" icon. Click on the icon and find and complete Glenwood Student Delegate Application". A direct link can be found here.

2) Delegate Selection Committee at each school

Following Policy 2010 Student Representation each HS and MS Administrative Point of Contact shall convene a Delegate Selection Committee. Each committee shall include the principal, the student council advisor or a counselor, and 3 students that are representative of the student body and the school's demographics. If you are interested in serving on the Delegate Selection Committee, please contact <u>Mrs. Shindel</u>.

3) Each Student Delegate Applicant Reviewed

Mrs. Shindel will lead Delegate Selection Committees in order to review each Student Delegate applicant from Glenwood to decide which students will represent Glenwood at the SMOB Convention.

4) Selection Committees Select Student Delegates

Following Policy 2010 Student Representation

Each MS Delegate Selection Committee shall select 1 student delegate from each grade (6, 7, and 8) for a total of 3 student delegates from each MS.

5) Student Delegate Names Submitted by 3/8/24

Mrs. Shindel will submit the names of students selected to serve as Student Delegates to the students managing the SMOB Convention

6) Student Delegate Training 3/14/24

All students selected to serve as delegates will attend the virtual **Delegate Training** Session on Thursday, March 14 from 4:00 pm - 5:00 pm (through their HCPSS Account) using Google Meet Code: DELEGATE-24.

The student led training session will help students serve as representative leaders for their school community. In addition to a description of the Student Member's position and brief descriptions of each Student Member of the Board applicant, delegates will receive detailed information about what to expect at SMOB Convention Day and how to assist their school throughout the SMOB process leading up to the General election in May.
